This will be our fourth year hosting Alternative Spring Breakers & we plan to get a lot done! In Spring, we begin our annual work-trader season of learning, teaching, growing & sharing. Over the past thirteen years thousands of people from over thirty-five countries have visited! This year we'll continue to offer many workshop gatherings for local youth, homeschoolers, community members and friends. In past years with visiting groups, we've built tiny cabins and a tree-house, maintained our off-grid microhydro and solar pv system, begun a lovely food forest, installed grey-water systems, built garden beds, tended animals, facilitated workshops and so much more!

Here's what we hope to get done in 2017...

- Expand community living quarters and further winterize present cabins to fit more people and let in more sunlight
- Transform the forest cabana into a weatherproof community space
- Renovate the old school bus & outfit it with bunks and a small woodstove
- Build a covered cordwood outdoor pavilion to house at least 50 people and earthen kitchen with cob oven
- Call in more fulltime stewards to help work this sacred land
- Offer more unique and vital teaching & learning opportunities on the farm, in our community and throughout our travels
- Continue to spread resilient living skills as part of our daily practice

We anticipate a \$10,000 budget to complete these projects using reclaimed, salvaged or primarily local resources.
